Concord and picked up shipments of food offered to our Pantry from NH Food Bank
and USDA. December turned out to be a very busy month with the normal deliveries on Mondays as well as Food Bank and USDA deliveries; all the generous donations we received and all of the food we gave out to those in need.

We gave out bags for Thanksgiving this year, including all of the fixings, a \$25.00 gift card from Shaws and a \$20.00 gift card from Hannaford in place of the turkeys. Thanks to all who helped on this project.

#### Happy New Year! Welcome to 2023!

Through the years as we approach a new year, many of us look back at the past year and decide to make an effort to improve ourselves as the new year begins. Approximately 38.5% of U.S. adults make New Year's resolutions. While looking up these statistics, I found an interesting fact. The first New Year's resolutions began 4,000 years ago in Babylonia. However, the New Year was not celebrated until mid-March to the first of April as a part of a 12-day Akitu Festival of their spring barley harvest.

Most recently, the top 3 resolutions tend to be health related; to exercise more, to eat healthier, and to lose weight, (48%, 44%, 41%). Spending more time with family/friends ranked 4<sup>th</sup>, (34%). This was followed by the desire to live more economically, 24%, spend less time on social media, 21%, reduce stress on the job, 21%, and quit smoking, 20%. There was no mention of increased church attendance or helping others or contributing to charities. I wondered what the Bible had to say about making an effort to start over. The following verses are just a few that give us an indication of God's thoughts about new beginnings:

"But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength, they will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint." Isaiah 40:31

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart and do not lean on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge him and he will make straight your paths." Proverbs 3:5-6




ple will see our church know that we are well liked within the community. You will be notified on your Facebook notifications when we post something new.

You will soon see Quick Response (QR) codes on church print materials including our bulletins, pew cards, newsletters, and event flyers. QR codes are a type of barcode that is typically linked to a website or an application. A QR code provides easy access to our website when scanned with a mobile device (phone) camera. The two QR codes below are different they both have a small image of our church in the center. The QR code on the left when scanned takes the user to our donation page. The QR code on the right goes to the home page of our website. There are many potential designs and uses for QR codes but these are two that we will be using for now.









The primary reason we have decided to begin using these QR codes is to provide an easy way for people to make donations and to learn more about our church. A lot of people no longer carry much cash with them. This has been evident in our plate donations when we have visitors who would have gladly made a donation, or perhaps given a larger donation but were not carrying cash.

In the future we will likely use QR codes for the Capital Campaign or other specifically targeted donations such as to the Food Pantry.


