'Tis the season to express gratitude, echoing the sentiments of the classic song that deems this the most wonderful time of the year. Thanksgiving prompts us to acknowledge the bountiful blessings bestowed upon us by God. As we step into Advent, a period marked by preparation and anticipation of God's ultimate gift—His Son, Jesus Christ—we embark on a reflection of the gifts our faith bestows: Hope, Peace, Joy, and Love, celebrated on each of the four Sundays of Advent.

In the Christian Church, Advent heralds the commencement of the New Year, starting on December 3rd.

Increasing our outreach can magnify our collective generosity. If financial constraints limit direct contributions, can we be more lavish with our time? The food pantry, for instance, often faces a shortage of volunteers. Unloading deliveries, stocking shelves, and preparing food for distribution are just a few ways our time can make a meaningful difference.

As we enter this season of reflection and giving, let us prayerfully contemplate how each of us, in our unique capacities, can contribute to the well-being and sustainability of The Brown Church in the year to come.

This is a busy month with Stewardship, Advent and planning for the Annual Meeting on January 28th. We are working on the challenging task again this year of how to balance the budget.

In November, instead of the regular Council meeting, we had a Roundtable meeting that included Council members and non-Council members. Thanks to the twenty who gave their time and input.

The next two years are critical in that we cannot continue to take funds out of the endowment to pay the bills. The questions posed to the group were (and we pose to all of you now) "What do you want this church to be personally? for the community? What do you want from a Minister at Brown Church?"

We have not put together a full report of the information we collected, but there were some common themes.

- The Brown church is friendly and welcoming.
- We need more people involved in volunteering to support the church missions, community connections and fundraising events.
- We would like more live music at the church services.
- We want a minister who can provide full pastoral services to the church family and community, whether full or part time
- Sermons that relate to and teach the scripture and today's life.
- Increase building use to support the community.

We will continue to work on this, to share with you all and discuss at the annual meeting. The biggest challenge facing us is how do we continue doing what we do well, improve and expand on it and financially support it. This is not an overnight fix, but we do need to make some decisions now.

We invite you all to come to the December 2nd event, Christmas Eve day and evening service at 10:00 am and 6:00 pm. Mark your calendars for



You will soon see Quick Response (QR) codes on church print materials including our bulletins, pew cards, newsletters, and event flyers. QR codes are a type of barcode that is typically linked to a website or an application. A QR code provides easy access to our website when scanned with a mobile device (phone) camera. The two QR codes below are different they both have a small image of our church in the center. The QR code on the left when scanned takes the user to our donation page. The QR code on the right goes to the home page of our website. There are many potential designs and uses for QR codes but these are two that we will be using for now.

The primary reason we have decided to begin using these QR codes is to provide an easy way for people to make donations and to learn more about our church. A lot of people no longer carry much cash with them. This has been evident in our plate donations when we have visitors who would have gladly made a donation, or perhaps given a larger donation but were not carrying


